- 3. Engaging participants in key aspects of leadership, including creative problem-solving, conflict resolution, trust building, and enhanced communication skills

Program Details

IGEL's program is a hands-on experience that spans nine months and will take you to five different locales around Georgia. The program focuses on providing leaders with the deep knowledge, advanced skills, and expansive network needed to address Georgia's environmental challenges now and in the future.

Participants are proven leaders who represent Georgia's economic, ethnic, geographic, and institutional diversity. It's essential to represent a wide range of professions, interests, political perspectives, and experiences.

Diverse Leaders with a Common Goal

Our core experiential, educational training program brings together a group of 30 leaders from across the state of Georgia for five, engaging and interactive two-to three-day experiences throughout the course of the program year. The intense, hands-on learning and dialogue taps into the experiences of experts who will lead and explore complex environmental issues. This is not a traditional conference room experience – it is an up-close, first-hand exploration and experience that affords leaders new perspectives and develops life-long relationships.

While 100% individual participation is expected, IGEL recognizes that extraordinary emergencies and unplanned situations may occur. The Program Committee reserves the right to authorize absences as requested by the participant or impose other measures for failure to participate at the 100% level.

IGEL Selection Criteria

Each IGEL class consists of participants from a wide range of professions, interests, political viewpoints, and experiences. All participants are evaluated and selected through a rigorous application process, with many applicants having to apply multiple times before being admitted.

- Application to IGEL is open to individuals residing within the State of Georgia
- Each class size is limited to thirty (30) participants
- Participants are selected by a committee based upon their individual merit and evaluated on the information provided on the application.
- IGEL seeks a diverse representation of organizations and individuals, to include academia, business, community, state, government, and non-profit throughout the State of Georgia,
- Applicants must have the full support of the organization represented in order to fully engage and participate for the duration of the program year.
- Attendance at each session is mandatory.
- In reviewing applications, the committee will consider the following criteria:
 - o Diverse and strong volunteer or work experience
 - o Policy-sharing responsibility and/or leadership experience
 - Experience and the proven ability to develop solutions to address Georgia's environmental challenges
 - Applicant's ability to make the time commitment as required by the program

Up to two letters of recommendation may be submitted, but are not required, and will be accepted up until the application deadline of October 11, 2024. **Recommendations received after the due date will not be considered.** Letters can be emailed to info@igeleaders.org or mailed directly to IGEL, Inc., P.O. Participant Fee

Tuition paid by each participant only partially covers the cost of instruction, materials, lodging and meals for the five sessions and the balance of the participation is subsidized by either public or private donations, in-kind gifts and/or other funds raised by the Board members and supporters of IGEL. Tuition does not cover any pre-or post-session lodging or activities.

Transportation arrangements and costs to and from each session are the responsibility of the participant and carpooling with other participants is encouraged. Costs and participation for the program are not extended to cover attendance of family members/significant others or friends.

If you are selected for the program, you will receive an invoice for your tuition, which will be due in full by December 30, 2024. Failure to remit the full amount of the tuition due by the identified deadline will result in the acceptance of the candidate being withdrawn; however, the candidate may reapply for the next program year.
